State Indicator Framework (SIF) has been developed by Technical Committee on SDGs after thorough discussion of the National Indicator Framework (NIF) released by MoSPI. Some indicators were customized and State specific indicators were added to better monitor the progress and achievements of SDGs in the State. As many as 197 indicators and 35 line departments were identified for the implementation of SDGs in Mizoram.
